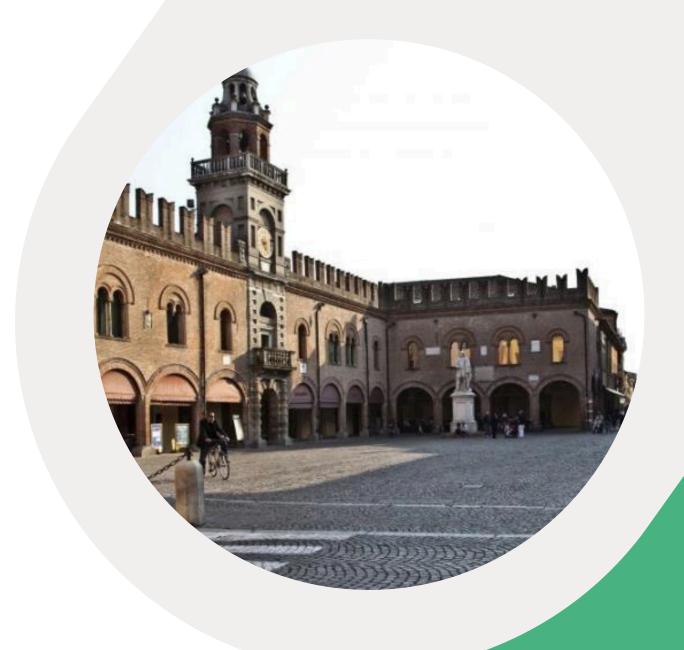


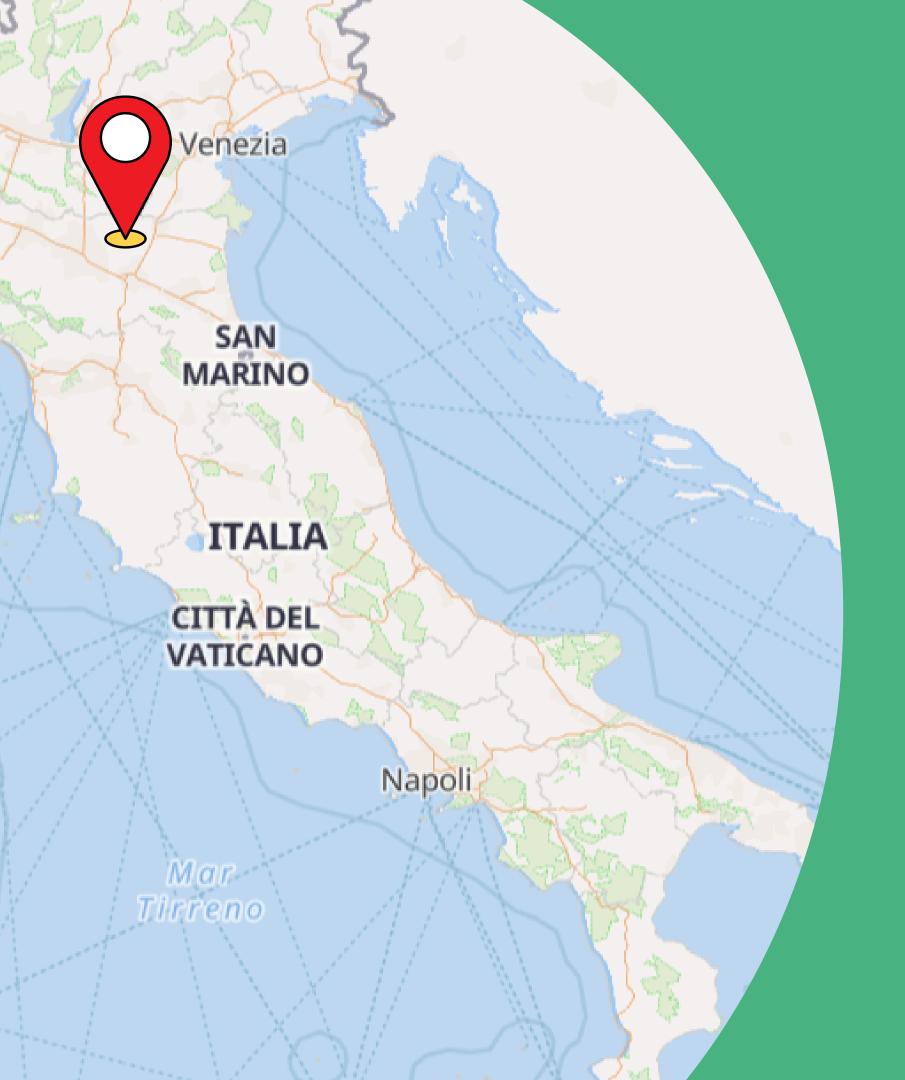

# A SNAPSHOT OF CENTO

• COUNTRY: ITALY

• **REGION:** EMILIA ROMAGNA

• **PROVINCE:** FERRARA

• **CITIZENS:** 35.716

• URBAN FUNCTIONAL AREA: 1 main town (Cento) and 8 hamlets

• FOREIGN CITIZENS: 5245 (15,1%)

STRATEGICAL POSITION AMONG THREE IMPORTANT CITIES: BOLOGNA, MODENA, FERRARA.



# The Challenge: mobility as a key to inclusion

Territorial fragmentation: hamlets far from the city center up to 18 km

Only the 49% of the population living in the main urban area

Lack of an effective public transport service, especially in the hamlets

Hamlets often inhabited by vulnerable groups of citizens

High car-dependency

Massive presence of commuters

**Actions:** Actions: Promote safe, accessible alternatives to cars;

Method: Inclusive, active citizen participation;







#### **Listening First: The Cento Mobility Survey**

Public questionnaire to understand daily mobility patterns (562 responses –  $\approx$ 1.6% of residents).

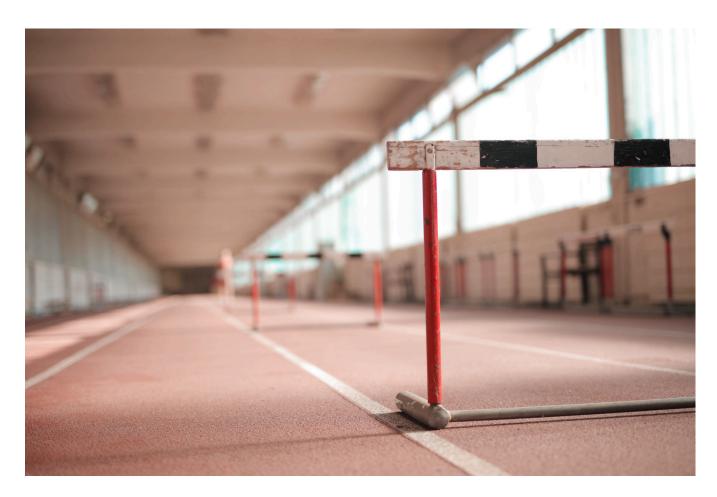
#### **Key findings:**

- "No single solution fits all gender differences clearly emerged."
- Respondents are mainly familiar with digital tools and mobility topics.
- 1 More men than women participated.
- Majority from the city center, fewer from suburban areas.
- A Higher education levels and private car ownership prevailed.





## From Insights to Action:



Focus shifted towards gender-sensitive mobility and the needs of vulnerable groups.

However, we soon realized some key obstacles:

Learning from Umeå: European Urban Initiative – City-to-City Exchange **Description:** Partnership with **Umeå (Sweden)** — one of the most advanced European cities in promoting gender equality — to learn about gender-sensitive governance and inclusive urban policies.

Context: The European Urban Initiative – City-to-City Exchange supports peer learning between European cities, allowing those with less experience to be guided by pioneers on specific urban development challenges.

# Using Gender-Segregated Data to Improve Local Services

- Data collection across services
- Access data by gender
- Qualitative surveys in municipal services
- E Library & Cultural Services
- 38% of women would join activities if held during school hours
- Action: Adjusted schedules & opening hours

#### **№** Mobility & Public Space

- 56% of women feel street design in favor of cars over pedestrians
- Action: Shift toward slow & safe mobility
- **6** Why it matters: Data reveals gender-specific needs and drives inclusive policies

- Go beyond data: capture lived experiences and perspectives;

# Women with migrant background:

Nr. 3 focus groups -45 participants;

#### Key Needs:

- Language and cultural barriers;
- Limited public transport access / social/economic exclusion
- Child-friendly mobility;

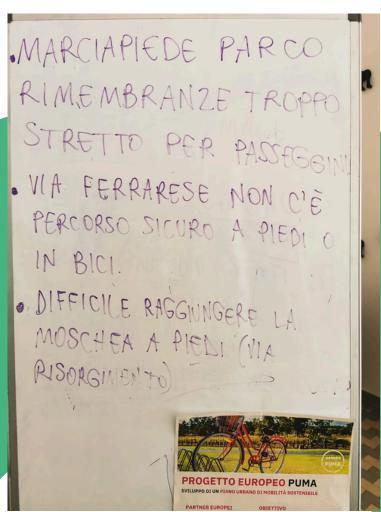
#### Planned Action:

- Municipal transport info point;
- Street-for-kids community space;











### Women <25 y.o.

Nr. 2 focus groups - 24 participants;

#### Key Needs:

- Public space safety
- Youth-friendly communal spaces
- Pedestrian & cyclist safety (slow mobility)
- Flexible public transport schedules

#### Planned Action:

- Co-design of park regeneration
- Road safety & slow mobility training in schools

## Women >65 y.o.

Nr. 2 focus groups - 40 participants;

#### Key Needs:

- Limited autonomy
- Distrust/fear of public transport

#### Planned Action:

· Feasibility study for on-demand transport linking elderly women to key services (e.g., municipal offices, hospital)
